This breakdown takes the median rating of the three agencies when all three agencies rate a security the lower of the two ratings if only two agencies rate a security and one rating if that is all that is provided. Ratings are measured on a scale that generally ranges from AAA (highest) to D (lowest); ratings are subject to change without notice. Not Rated indicates that the debtor was not rated and should not be interpreted as indicating low quality. Below investment-grade is represented by a rating of BB and below. Ratings and portfolio credit quality may change over time.

The yield figure reflects the dividends and interest earned during the period, after the deduction of the fund's expenses. This is also referred to as the "standardized yield." The number is then annualized. This yield does not necessarily reflect income actually earned and distributed by the Fund, and therefore may not be correlated with dividends and distributions paid. Had fees not been waived and or/expenses reimbursed, the SEC Yield would have been lower Alpha measures the risk-adjusted return of an investment relative to its benchmark index. Beta is a measure of an investment's price volatility relative to that of the overall market. **Net asset value (NAV)** is value of a fund's assets minus its liabilities. Dividing by the total shares outstanding results in NAV per share. **Price-to-earnings ratio (P/E ratio)** compares a company's stock price to its earnings per share. **Standard deviation** is a statistical measure of volatility that captures the degree to which an investment's price has deviated from its average over time.

MSCI World Index (Net) measures the performance of large and midcap equities across developed markets countries. A net-return index tracks price changes and reinvestment of distribution income net of withholding taxes. Bloomberg US Aggregate Bond Index (Gross/Total) measures the performance of the investment grade, US dollar-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market in the US, including Treasuries, government-related and corporate securities, fixed-rate agency MBS (agency fixed-rate and hybrid ARM passthroughs), ABS, and CMBS. A total-return index tracks price changes and reinvestment of distribution income. Bloomberg Global Aggregate Index (Gross/Total) measures the performance of investment grade debt from local currency markets worldwide. The multi-currency benchmark includes treasury, government-related, corporate and securitized fixed rate bonds from both developed and emerging markets.
